The Qalipu Mi'kmaq First Nation Band is seeking 18 members; both male and female, to undergo a series of training modules and project overview to better prepare them for employment opportunities with the NSPML Project. This training initiative will increase their opportunity to be placed on site during this project.

**Qualifications**: Candidates must be actively seeking employment and is willing and able to work. This training initiative will have a particular emphasis on gender diversity and we aim to attract both aboriginal men and women into this program.
