Conservation Corps Newfoundland and Labrador's employment programs provide young people with meaningful work, training and educational opportunities in the areas of environmental and cultural conservation and enhancement. We are currently seeking individuals to coordinate and supervise our summer-based employment programs. Regional Supervisor is a mentored position that is responsible for recruitment, training, communications, oversight, team dynamics evaluation and management, administrative requirements and other tasks associated with the smooth follow through of ~3-6 teams of ~2-4 individuals each (please note that these numbers may vary) that are working toward the locally determined conservation goals of community partners in the province of NL. We will require a total of four Regional Supervisors, spread across the following regions: Labrador, Avalon, Metro, Central, and Western/Northern Peninsula. Applicants may reside in any of the identified regions.

Important Position Duration Information:

- Regional Supervisors will ideally, initially, work part time, 10 hrs/wk from March 11 May 3,
 2024 with flexible scheduling.
- RS's will then transition to full time employment (35 hrs/wk) from May 6 August 23, 2024.

- Focus on developing personal leadership skills in yourself and the youth you lead.
