Grade Control Technician

Reporting to the Senior Mine Resource Geologist, the Grade Control Technician will be responsible for carrying out a variety of geology assignments and assisting in multiple areas of the Mine Geology Department.

This position will be located at the Project site, working on a 14 days in/14 days out rotation.

Accountabilities/Responsibilities:

- Establish and promote a respectful and healthy work environment.
- Participate in grade control processes, providing support to senior geological staff.
- Conduct chip sampling from RC rig and perform chip logging and sample dispatch as required.
- Collect in-field ARD and ML samples
- Contribute to daily, weekly, and monthly reports.
- Conduct digitized geological mapping of mineralized and/or sterile development.
- Provide monitoring, tracking, and reporting on tonnes in the active pit.
- Perform field surveying using high-accuracy GPS for drillhole setup and collar surveying.
- Strive for continuous improvement in all responsibilities.
- Ensure work is performed safely and efficiently while adhering to all company policies and procedures.
- Provide technical support and consultation to senior geological staff, including geological interpretation.
- Conduct sample collection and QA/QC of samples, as well as data management.
- Delineate grade blocks and perform field inspections.
- Perform other duties as required.



Education and Experience:

- A College Diploma in a geological related field or post-Secondary completion in a related field of study.
- A minimum of 3 years of mining experience, preferably in a remote industrial environment.
- Experience in a remote work site is required.
- A valid driver's license and driver's abstract required.
