# Level II Blaster Competition # MG0068

The Level II Blaster is a team member of the mine department and is responsible to assist with the blasting of rock and ore in a safe manner to achieve daily production targets. This role must ensure work is performed in accordance with health, safety, environmental and legislative requirements.

This position is located at the project site, working on a 14 days in / 14 days out rotation.

### Accountabilities/Responsibilities:

- Be a courageous health, safety, and environment advocate, adhere to and promote health, safety and environmental standards, policies, and procedures.
- Assist Level III Blasters where necessary.
- Mentor, coach, and train Level I Blasters.
- Communicate effectively and professionally with other team members.
- Actively participate in orientation and training programs.
- Follow all safety procedures while operating equipment.
- Adhere to all company policies.
- Report any concerns to the supervisor.
- Perform work on a rotational basics (i.e., day and night shifts).
- Meet loading and blasting targets.
- Conduct daily inspections of the work area.
- Work with Mine Engineer and Mine Supervisors in developing blast plans.
- Complete Blast Reports.
- Prime and load bulk emulsion product safely as per the blast plan.
- Stem holes as required.
- Maintain accurate magazine inventories.
- Communicate and coordinate with Explosive supplier, the delivery of explosive products to site.
- Actively participate in orientation and training programs.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

# **Education and Experience Required:**

- Level II (Newfoundland & Labrador) blasters license or equivalent
- Valid TDG & WHIMIS training is required
- Must hold a valid Class 5 driver license and a driver's abstract.
- Minimum 2 years' experience blasting in a quarry and or open pit mining environment.
- Experience working in a remote industrial environment is preferred.

- Knowledge of health, safety, and environmental requirements at remote sites.
- Excellent coordination and driving skills.
- Strong knowledge of the OHS, mining, and construction regulations.
- Strong attention to detail, accuracy, and safety.
- Experience with radio communication and protocols.

- Strong team building skills.
- Attention to detail being careful about detail and thorough in completing tasks.
