Senior Mine Engineer

The Senior Mine Engineer plays a key role in the supervision of the Mine engineering department. This role delivers and provides high quality technical services to achieve departmental objectives. This role supports the department's vision to optimize productivity and maintain the profitability of the operation, while promoting and respecting the Health & Safety, Code of Conduct and protection of the environment.

As this is a startup operation, the successful candidate must have a strong focus on systems and employee development to help achieve operational readiness and support achievement of production objectives.

Additionally, the role provides development opportunity as there may be occasions that acting as the Technical Services Manager is required.

This position is located at the Project site, working on a 14 days in/14 days out rotation.

Accountabilities/Responsibilities:

- Supervise the engineering department, directing workflow and planning workforce needs to ensure proper level of efficiency and productivity.
- Responsible to supervise, mentor, coach, and assist staff to meet the expected performance level for Valentine Gold and, where necessary, develop and manage performance improvement plans.
- Provide work direction for Planners and Engineers to deliver short to long term planning and designs required to support the mine production and development.
- Collaborate with the Planners in analyzing various mine plan scenarios to identify, assess, and capture opportunities for the life of mine plan.
- Conduct pit optimization exercises for life of mine planning and Mineral Reserves, provide mine operating and capital cost analysis and contribute to technical inputs such as rock mechanics, dump design and water pumping.
- Collaborate with other departments to ensure proper coordination in terms of reporting, planning, forecasting, stockpile management, month-end reporting, and other shared activities.



- Manage the development of operational and procedural structures to ensure standardization and quality of the work across the team.
- Oversee the equipment dispatching team to ensure optimal production decisions, controls and direction of the mine plan.
- Assist in the different phases of budgeting, forecasting, and cost control process.
- Conduct various HR activities, including development plans and evaluations.
- Adhere to all company policies and procedures.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

Education and Experience:

- Mining Engineering or Civil Engineering degree.
- Minimum of 10 years of experience in an open pit mining operation, with 5 years supervisory experience.
- Experience in a remote work site is required.
