

# Environmental Monitoring Coordinator



Enroll in the 8 week Environmental Monitoring Coordinator (EMC) certificate program, delivered by the College of the North Atlantic in partnership with Environmental Careers Organization (ECO) Canada and the Ocean's Supercluster. EMCs observe the environment and the impacts of human and industrial activities. They communicate this information to various partner groups and help to lessen negative environmental impacts.

Designed for Indigenous youth of Newfoundland and Labrador (NL), this customized program will focus on knowledge and perspectives that are unique to the ocean sector. The EMC program will deliver training that provides all the necessary technical, cultural, safety and soft-skills required to secure meaningful employment in the environmental sector.

The program is broken into three main components:

1. Environmental Core Module (3 weeks)
2. Environmental Monitoring - Regulatory Specialization (2 weeks)
3. Workplace Skill Development (3 weeks)

**Location:** Bay St. George Campus

**Entrance Requirements:** Indigenous youth 18-30 years of age, minimum Grade 8 education.
