Parks Canada, in partnership with Qalipu Mi'kmaq First Nation Band is offering unique employment opportunities to Qalipu students and members.

Parks Canada protects some of the most special places in Canada, including Gros Morne National Park, L'Anse aux Meadows National Historic Site and Port au Choix National Historic Site on the West coast of Newfoundland.

Gros Morne National Park is known for its majestic beauty as well as its spectacular geology and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Significant for both its cultural and natural heritage, it is often the star of Newfoundland tourism ads, shown all over the world.

L'Anse aux Meadows National Historic Site, the only authenticated Viking site in North America, is also recognised by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site. This 1000-year old archaeological site is brought to life by a team of guides in Viking regalia.

Port au Choix National Historic Site commemorates the ancient Indigenous presence on the Northern Peninsula, dating back 5500 years. The archaeological site represents Maritime Archaic Indian, Paleo-Eskimo and Dorset peoples and also protects two floral species at risk, found only in Newfoundland.

- Wear a Parks Canada uniform or period costume

### Interpreter

### Resource Conservation Technician Student

- Assist in ecological integrity monitoring projects, natural resource stewardship, species at risk recovery and GIS analysis.

- May work unusual or extended hours (weekends and overnight) and in remote areas.
- Must be comfortable working in the outdoors and wilderness settings (possibly in adverse weather).
- Must be prepared for physically demanding work.
