The Position: University College of the North (UCN), Manitoba's newest post-secondary institution invites applications for a full time tenure track position in its Aboriginal and Northern Studies Program Area (ANS) at the rank of Assistant and Associate Professor within the Faculty of Arts, Business and Science. Responsibilities for this position include teaching, research, and community service. Experience in Aboriginal languages program development and delivery as well as quality control of all language resource products and services within the ANS program area of Aboriginal Languages with a particular focus on the Cree language will also be essential to this position. The primary duties of this position is to assist with the development of the Cree language programming and curriculum. The successful candidate will teach the existing Cree language courses and will lead the development of the Cree language curriculum, and provide expertise and collegial contributions to the Faculty of Arts, Science and Business, students, and faculty in area of Aboriginal language and culture.

- PhD in Linguistics or Applied Linguistics
- The ability to speak the Cree language
- Experience in development and delivery of Aboriginal languages program
- Experience in both oratory and linguistic approaches to Cree language instruction
- Demonstrated traditional knowledge in the area of specialization will be given consideration
- Effective leadership skills
- Effective communication skills
- Strong organizational skills
- Strong self-management skills
- Effective interpersonal skills
- Demonstrated ability to understand and deal with issues specific to Aboriginal learners and mature students in northern Manitoba
- Personal experience and/or knowledge and understanding of the Aboriginal culture
