Responsibilities: The Aboriginal Fisheries Guardian will work with an assigned partner to conduct enforcement and research activities throughout their posting in Newfoundland. This is a field position. Official training and designation will be provided to the successful candidate as soon as possible. Successful completion of training leading to designation will result in the trainee advancing to full Aboriginal Fisheries Guardian status. This position will include the following:

- Biological Research Data collection for various Biological studies conducted by Qalipu Natural Resources

- Ability to work independently and unsupervised
