

# **Newsletter Update for Indigenous Peoples** Related to Bills C-68 & C-69

June 2019

#### Status of the Bills

Bill C-68, An Act to amend the Fisheries Act and other Acts in consequence, and Bill C-69, An Act to enact the Impact Assessment Act and the Canadian Energy Regulator Act, to amend the Navigation Protection Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts, were passed by the House of Commons and the Senate. The Governor General gave Royal Assent to both Bills on Friday, June 21, 2019. The timing of coming into force of both Bills will be determined at a later date.

# **Purpose**

To provide Indigenous peoples with information related to Bills C-68 and C-69, including engagement opportunities on regulatory and policy development.



### **Background**

In February 2018, the Government introduced two pieces of legislation.

- Bill C-68, An Act to amend the Fisheries Act and other Acts in consequence; and,
- Bill C-69, An Act to enact the Impact Assessment Act and the Canadian Energy Regulator Act, to amend the Navigation Protection Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts.

The objectives of Bill C-68 are to restore lost protections and incorporate modern safeguards into the *Fisheries Act*, provide greater certainty for industry, ensure strong and meaningful protection for our fish and waters, and advance reconciliation with Indigenous peoples.

The objectives of Bill C-69 are to deliver better rules for the assessment of major projects, to protect the environment and waterways, to ensure public confidence in how decisions about resource development projects are made, and to advance reconciliation with Indigenous peoples, while providing certainty to industry and investors.
