**Job Description and Requirements:** Reporting to the Aboriginal Fisheries Strategy Coordinator, The Aboriginal Fisheries Guardian Trainee will be responsible for enforcement and research activities associated with Qalipu's Aboriginal Fisheries Strategy (AFS)

**Responsibilities:** The Aboriginal Fisheries Guardian (AFG) Trainee will work with an assigned partner to assist in enforcement and research activities throughout their posting in Newfoundland. This is a field position. Successful completion of training leading to designation will result in the trainee advancing to full Aboriginal Fisheries Guardian status. This position will include the following:

- Fisheries Enforcement on various rivers surrounding your posting.
- Biological Research Data collection for various Biological studies conducted by Qalipu Natural Resources
- Community/Youth Engagement
- Maintain detailed daily logs
- Other duties as assigned
